We will keep you posted on details, as the dates get closer. Your child's teacher will be in touch regarding party times and items needed, if you are interested. Vacation is around the corner! As a reminder, the last day of school before the upcoming vacation is next Friday, December 16th. We will remain closed through New Year's and reopen on **Tuesday, January 3rd**. Please note, as New Year's Day falls on a Sunday, schools will remain closed on Monday, January 2nd in observance of the holiday. We will see you all on Tuesday, January 3rd. Happy New Year to you all! We hope 2023 is a wonderful year for you all!

Thoughts on Winter Gear: Yes, the cold weather is upon us! Going forth, you can assume we will still be going outside daily. If the temperature is above 20 degrees including wind chill, we do try to get the kids out for even a short playtime. The fresh air is so good for us all!

As you know, we work hard to keep our classrooms as healthy as possible, and while we do have HEPA air filters running at all times in the classroom, we also keep a few windows open in all classrooms (not wide, just a little), to allow for better ventilation, as the research indicates that this can make a considerable difference in mitigating the spread of germs. Because of this, the classrooms can be cool. Bulky, long sleeved sweaters can make frequent hand washing, painting and eating difficult, but **VESTS are a wonderful way to keep your child warm in the classroom**. You may want to consider having your child wear a vest in the classroom, we have many children who do that now and it seems to work wonderfully. Either a fleece, or thin puffy vest (or whatever you have) will work nicely and allow those hands and arms to be freed up for activities throughout the day! This is simply a suggestion, and in no way required. Just a thought we wanted to pass along!

We wanted to share some thoughts on what we have found works best for a daily "winter gear routine" at SVP. Thank you!

- Please find a **small "snow bag"** to send all of your child's snow gear in every day. This bag will hang on your child's coat hook in the hallway, so please don't send any oversized or wide, stiff bags. **The re-usable, soft grocery bags are the perfect size for us, as we need to fit many bags side by side on the hooks.**
- **Be sure to LABEL ALL ITEMS (even boots).** This is tremendously helpful for us, as many children have the same items and may not recognize what you have sent in.
- **We ask that you send your child to school wearing mittens, not gloves,** unless he/she is able to put the gloves on independently.
- **Please do not send scarves to school, or the hats with the very long sides.** They pose a safety hazard on the playground, as they could catch on equipment or while running.
- Please include **slippers** (or sneakers) in your child's snow bag every day through the winter.

- **Try to take some time over the next week or two to help your child practice putting on his/her own coat, mittens, hat, boots, etc., when you are heading outside.** This not only helps them understand the process, but it also familiarizes them with their own gear, as young children aren't always sure which items they brought to school each day. We will practice and assist with this at school, but practice at home is so helpful. Thank you!

*Note: If we remain snow free and above freezing for the next two weeks, you can wait until January to start sending in snow pants. We do however, suggest you start the practice of sending in a "snow bag" with a hat, mittens and slippers in it every day.

Winter Weather School Cancellation & Delay Policy for SVP

We ask that you take a few moments to read through our Winter Weather School Cancellation and Delay Policy. Southborough Village Preschool's main objective during winter weather is to ensure the safety of our staff members, students and their families. Please let us know if you have any question at all.

School Closing: If the Southborough Public Schools are closed due to inclement weather, Southborough Village Preschool will always be closed as well. While we will make an effort to email you in the case of a closing, there is always the chance that, due to power outages, this will not be possible. We strongly recommend that you rely on the news/radio/websites for information regarding school closings. If Southborough Public Schools are closed, Southborough Village Preschool will also be closed.

Delayed Opening: If Southborough Public Schools announce a weather related delay, then Southborough Village Preschool will also have a weather related delay. If there is a 2-hour delay, all morning classes at the Preschool will be cancelled, PM classes will most likely be held, and Full Day classes will begin at 11:00 AM. In the case of a delay, Full-Day students will still eat lunch at school.

Early Drop-Off: In the case of a 2-hour delay, we will make every attempt to be open by 10:30 AM, if you are in need of early Drop-off (Full Day students only - this is not available for PM classes). However, we ask that you call the office that morning to be certain that we are indeed able to open at 10:30 AM, as there is always a chance that our parking lot and sidewalks will still be in the process of being cleared.

Early Release: We reserve the right of judgment to close Southborough Village Preschool early due to poor weather conditions. In this case, parents and caregivers will be notified as quickly as possible.

Note: Don't forget that, while school may not be cancelled, you can always feel comfortable making the decision to keep your child at home, whenever the driving conditions are of concern to you.

- **Friday, December 16th:** Last Day of Classes before Winter Vacation
- **Tuesday, January 3rd:** School Re-opens. Happy New Year!
